## Reception Medium Term Objectives

### Literacy

#### 30-50

- Shows awareness of rhyme and alliteration.
- Listens to stories with increasing attention and recall.
- Handles books carefully.
- Looks at books independently.
- Sometimes gives meaning to marks as they draw and paint.

#### 40-60

- Hears and say initial sounds in words.
- Can segment the sounds in simple words and blend them together.
- Begins to read words and sentences.
- Enjoys an increasing range of books.
- Knows that information can be retrieved from books and computers.
- Begins to break the flow of speech into words.
- Gives meaning to marks they make as they draw or write.
- Links sounds to letter, naming and sounding the letters of the alphabet.
- Writes own name and other things such as labels, captions and lists.

### Mathematics

#### 30-50

- Uses some number names accurately in play.
- Sometimes matches numeral and quantity correctly.
- Shows an interest in number.
- Uses shapes appropriately for a task.
- Shows interest in shapes in their environment.

#### 40-60

- Recognise the numerals from 0 to 10.
- Counts objects to 10 and then beyond 10.
- Selects the correct numeral to represent 1-10 objects.
- Uses the language of 'more' and 'fewer' to compare groups of objects.
- Records using marks they can interpret and explain.
- Says the number one more than a given number.
- Beginning to use mathematical names for 2D and 3D shapes and describe their features.

### PSED/Seal

- Understands that we are all unique and special for different reasons.
- Understands how to be a good friend.
- Begin to take responsibility for small tasks.

### C&L

#### 30-50

- Listens to others one to one or in a small group.
- Is able to follow directions.
- Responds to simple instructions.
- Can retell a simple past event in the correct order.
- Builds up a vocabulary that reflects the breath of their experiences.

**30-50**

- Can momentarily stand on one foot when shown.
- Can catch a large ball.
- Holds pencil between the thumb and two fingers.
- Can usually manage washing and drying hands.
- Dresses with help.

- Experiments with different ways of moving.
- Jumps off an object and lands appropriately.
- Travels with confidence and skill around, under, over and through balancing and climbing equipment.
- Shows increasing control over an object in throwing and catching.
- Begins to form recognisable letters.

Uses a pencil and holds it effectively.

**Expressive Arts & Design**

**30-50**

- Uses various construction materials.
- Sings a few familiar songs.
- Realises tools can be used for a purpose.
- Creates movement in response to music.
- Engages in imaginative role-play based on own activities.
