-The provision of a School Sport Specialist for one day. The specialist worked with all teachers/classes and also ran an after-school activities. The focus was staff develop so a team teaching model was utilised with the staff teaching and lesson with the specialist, then 1 on their own before returning to work with the specialist. Each teacher had this for half a year. The areas we focused on were the areas staff felt they needed more support – gymnastics, dance, OAA and invasion games. Each term a different curriculum area is taught and throughout the year units of work on athletics, dance, OAA, cricket. The after-school provision was planned to ensure that children from all a range of classes had the opportunity to participate at some point in the year.
