### SCARLET FEVER

We currently have a case of Scarlet Fever in school. Scarlet Fever is extremely contagious, so please be vigilant.

The first signs of Scarlet Fever can be flu-like symptoms, including a high temperature, a sore throat and swollen neck glands.

A rash appears 12 to 48 hours later. It looks like small, raised bumps and starts on the chest and stomach. The rash makes the skin feel rough.

If your child displays these symptoms they are advised to see the GP who will prescribe antibiotics, without these it can become a serious illness.

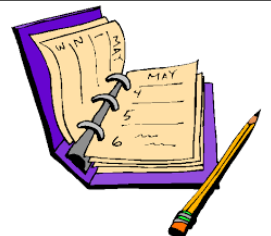
